

1. TITLE: Bullying: Using Group Treatment to Induce Awareness and Prevention
2. PRESENTER: Ilana D. Rosenberg, Ph.D.

3. DESCRIPTION: This experiential workshop will help participants expand their knowledge about group functioning that contributes to bullying behavior and facilitate group treatment to prevent and respond to bullying.
4. OBJECTIVES: Participants will be able to:
 - (A) Describe and differentiate between bullying and non-bullying behaviors and identify youth at risk for victimizing or becoming a victim.
 - (B) Note ways in which group functioning positively and negatively impacts bullying behavior.
 - (C) List two skills on how to facilitate social skills group counseling to youth to effectively prevent and respond to bullying behavior.
