Description:

This workshop will focus on how to attend to our own experience with illness while staying aware of our own role as therapist. Through an experiential exercise, video interviews, group participation and didactic teaching we will grapple with the broad range of issues concerning self-disclosure/non-disclosure in the group therapy setting, and how that impacts the therapist as well as the client. Principles of Contextual Self-Led Disclosure will be discussed.

1. Hold the significance of self-awareness and self-care while coping with one's own vulnerabilities with an illness or mortality.
2. Name 5 internal beliefs that guide how therapists deal with their illness in their professional lives.
3. Explore 3 issues that make the group therapy experience different than individual therapy when the therapist is dealing with their illness and/or mortality.
4. Identify the 4 Principles of Contextual Self-Led Disclosure.
